IT: Coding Our Changing Planet

Step into the role of a digital designer and create eco-themed graphical patterns using coding. You'll use shapes, colours and sequences to model landscapes, oceans and habitats, exploring how technology can help us visualise and protect our world. No previous coding experience needed, just curiosity and creativity!

Mathematics: Build Your Own Sustainable Nation

Design a brand-new country inspired by the best features of our world. Using real data and mathematical modelling, you'll sketch borders to scale, map mountains and rivers, create population profiles, design a currency and set an exchange rate. You will build climate graphs, sunshine hours and rainfall patterns, then calculate your country's GDP. It's global citizenship, powered by maths.

English: Discover a Hidden Corner of the Earth

Imagine you've stumbled upon a newly discovered part of our planet. What does it look like? Who lives there? How does the landscape shape its stories? You'll create vivid descriptions, draw the world you've found and write a poem inspired by its beauty, fragility and mystery. Enjoy a creative celebration of the wonders of our world.

Science: The Elements of Our Atmosphere

Investigate the colourful secrets hidden in Earth's crust and atmosphere. Through flame tests, you'll explore how the elements found on Earth produce different colours and carry out tests on gases found in our atmosphere.

PRE: Protecting Our World for the Future

Explore how different religions teach stewardship, care for creation and responsibility towards animals, humans and the planet. Debate ethical questions such as: Should humans still eat meat? Use impact cards to compare environmental footprints and discuss how belief shapes action. Think deeply about how we protect our shared world.

Classics: Worlds Within Worlds

Travel back to ancient global civilisations to discover how interconnected the ancient world truly was. Explore Roman Britain, ancient trade routes and ideas that crossed continents. Reflect on the "inner world" through the wisdom of thinkers such as Cicero and Marcus Aurelius, then design your own ancient-inspired world on a vase.

DT & Engineering: Solar Transport for a Greener World

Become a future innovator as you design a solar-powered transport prototype. Explore sustainable engineering and how new technologies can help protect our planet. Test your model, refine it and see how renewable energy can power our world forward.

French: Exploring the Francophone World

Discover the many French-speaking countries across the globe. Through games, clues and cultural challenges, explore how the French language connects continents, from Africa to the Caribbean to Europe. Join us for a fun journey celebrating global cultures and the diversity of our world.

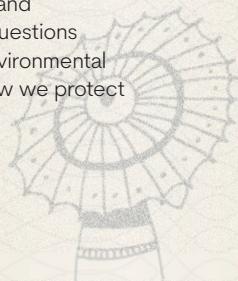
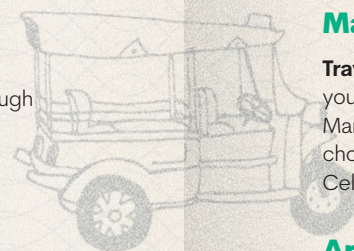
Mandarin: The Global Language Passport

Geography: Design a Country from the Best of Our World

Create your own nation inspired by Earth's most spectacular landscapes. Choose the climate, landforms, ecosystems and cultural features you love most, then map them onto your new country. A creative way to explore what makes our world so diverse and extraordinary.

History: Cultures That Shaped Our World

Journey across continents as you explore major cultural developments from around the globe. Discover how different civilisations contributed to art, science, technology and environmental knowledge, and celebrate the global diversity reflected in our own SCHS community.

Music: Soundscapes of Our World

Create an atmospheric soundscape inspired by the natural rhythms of our planet. Using found sounds and electronic effects inspired by Delia Derbyshire, you'll build your own musical journey through forests, oceans, cities and skies, capturing the heartbeat of our world through sound.

Drama: Telling Stories of Our Shared World

Start with lively ice-breaker games, then explore characters and stories from Caryl Churchill's Love and Information, re-imagined through the lens of human connection across our world. You'll adapt dialogue, shape characters and perform a piece that brings global stories and shared experiences to life.
